

# All Things New

## Revelation 21:1-8

Four times in this section of Scripture, God uses the word, “new.” We see:

- A New Heaven, vs. 1
- A New Earth, vs. 1
- New Jerusalem, vs. 2
- God making all things new, vs. 5

### #1 - God Will Create A New Heaven And A New Earth, Revelation 21:1

Our God is a redeeming God. Ever since humanity sinned, God has been at work overcoming our disobedience and all the consequences that came from that.

We are all sinners by physical birth, the Bible says in Romans 5:12

12 Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned—

But, it wasn't just humanity that was effected by that sin in the Garden of Eden. As a result of Adam & Eve's sin, all of creation was tainted. Look what God said to Adam as a result of his sin in Genesis 3:17b-19

17b Cursed is the ground because of you; In toil you will eat of it All the days of your life.

18 “Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; And you will eat the plants of the field;

19 By the sweat of your face You will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return.”
